The Community Foundation of Central Illinois is a philanthropic resource that supports positive initiatives and innovative approaches to addressing the changing needs of our region.


Our purpose is to strengthen our community through engaged grant making and strategic partnerships with other organizations.

A LETTER FROM THE CEO AND BOARD CHAIR

DEAR FRIENDS OF THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF CENTRAL ILLINOIS,

We are pleased to present the Annual Report of the Community Foundation of Central Illinois (CFCI) for the fiscal year 2022.

Throughout the past year, we have worked to fulfill our mission of "Connecting People Who Care with Causes That Matter" and have supported the community in a wide variety of ways. CFCI granted \$6.9 million throughout our service area this past year, enabling new projects to launch and vital programs to continue, all with the goal of improving the quality of life throughout central Illinois.

In addition to our grantmaking efforts, we have also engaged in initiatives that aim to build stronger communities. Our work is only possible thanks to the generosity of supporters like you, who share our commitment to making a positive difference in the lives of those around us.

The 2022 Annual Report offers a comprehensive look at our Foundation's activities, accomplishments, as well as a financial summary. Our report highlights include:

- Grantmaking in workforce readiness focused on job creation and retention through the Gilmore Fund.
- Supporting local arts organizations through funding for performances, festivals, educational programming and increased economic impact with The Arts Mean Business and Community Arts grants.
- Grants for initiatives and programming aimed at addressing food insecurity and hunger issues.
- Wide-ranging Community Needs grant funding for after-school programs, legal aid, mental health initiatives, and much more.

Rest assured that our hard work on behalf of the greater central Illinois community continues in this current fiscal year. We are laying the groundwork for our next strategic plan, which promises to provide a road map to some exciting and innovative new initiatives to come. The future is looking very bright for CFCI.

While writing this year's report, we received news of the passing of Donna Haerr, the first executive director of the Peoria Area Community Foundation. Donna took on the role of executive director in 1988, during which time the Foundation had no endowment and had never granted any funding to nonprofit organizations. However, under her leadership, the Foundation's endowment grew to \$1.6 million, and more than \$738,000 was distributed to nonprofits by the time of her retirement just seven years later. Donna was a visionary leader whose legacy inspires us to continue serving our community with dedication to her philanthropic ideals. As we carry on her vision, we remain forever grateful for Donna's contributions and the impact she made on our Foundation.

We would like to take this opportunity to express our sincere gratitude for your continued support of the Community Foundation of Central Illinois. With your help, we will continue to make a meaningful difference in the lives of individuals and families in our community.






